Feeding America Riverside – San Bernardino Hosts Successful Holiday Drive-Thru Food Distribution

Nearly 350 Local Families Supported with Thanksgiving Meals

Riverside, Calif. — December X, 2025 — Feeding America Riverside | San Bernardino (FARSB), successfully hosted its annual Holiday Drive-Thru Food Distribution on Friday, November 14, at the FARSB Riverside warehouse. The event helped provide much-needed food assistance to nearly 350 local families facing food insecurity this holiday season, including Thanksgiving-themed meals of turkeys, pies and boxes of fresh produce.

Successful large-scale efforts like this rely on the help of corporate partners, such as Bank of America which recently provided a \$25,000 grant, along with its local employee volunteers who helped with check-in, traffic flow and loading holiday meal kits into vehicles. Bank of America has also provided grants and employee volunteer support to FARSB over the years as part of its focus on helping people overcome barriers to success, such as hunger relief.
